In a recent video, opponents of transgender civil rights made absurd claims about the bill.

Here are the facts.

## FICTION

“The ‘Bathroom Bill’ creates genderless restrooms in public schools.”

“The ‘Bathroom Bill’ requires boys and girls be allowed to use whatever locker room they want.”

“The ‘Bathroom Bill’ mandates access to school sports teams for any gender.”

## FACT

Restrooms will remain separate. Transgender Civil Rights **DOES NOT CREATE** genderless restrooms. That’s just fear talking, a poor excuse for opposing fairness for transgender folks.

This Civil Rights bill allows people “born in the wrong body,” who identify and live full-time in the gender opposite their birth sex, to use facilities appropriate for their gender identity. It **DOES NOT ALLOW** boys in girls locker rooms or vice versa.

This Civil Rights bill **DOES NOT CHANGE** gender rules for sports participation. Title 9 (US Education Amendments of 1972) already addresses such issues.

Enough “bathroom talk,” it’s time to pass this bill.  
It’s the right thing to do.

# TRANSGENDER CIVIL RIGHTS PASS IT NOW

H.1728/S.1687, “An Act Relative to Gender-Based Discrimination and Hate Crimes, AKA the Transgender Civil Rights bill, updates MA non-discrimination and hate crimes laws to clearly and uniformly protect all people regardless of their gender identity or gender expression. This includes transgender people, who face extreme discrimination and violence due to widespread prejudice, as well as assumption that they are outside of the law’s protections. Transgender people deserve equal opportunity for jobs, housing, credit, education, and access to public places like stores, restaurants, libraries, and museums, etc., just like everyone else, without fear of discrimination or harassment.
